Architecture

The Danish Arts Foundation works to foster the international cultural development and the promotion of Danish Architecture abroad.

The Danish Arts Foundation's Committee for Architecture runs a number of international and national funding programmes. The programmes are intended for architects, studios, and institutions with a relation to the Danish architecture scene.

Funding

Name: **Project Funding**

Who may apply: Architects, studios and institutions with a strong relation to the Danish architecture scene can apply. If applying as a cross-disciplinary group the application should come from the architect.

Purpose of the program: With the project-funding program The Committee for Architecture wish to encourage surprising and thought provoking projects. Projects with an ambition to push the boundaries of the field of architecture. Projects which exhibit a critical and ethical awareness about the role architecture plays in relation to its surroundings. Projects may range from exhibitions, art installations, books, films, festivals, events, seminars and much more.

Deadline: Two annual deadlines (February and September)

Residencies

Name: Can Lis – Jørn Utzon's House

Who may apply: Danish architects, cross-disciplinary groups and other professionals with a relation to the Danish architecture scene may apply.

Purpose of the program: A residency programme at Can Lis on Mallorca that provides the possibility for architects and cross-disciplinary groups to develop their work in the inspiring surroundings of Utzon's architecture and former private home. The Danish Arts Foundation offers up to 12 residency periods a year at either 13 or 26 days. *Deadline:* one annual deadline (September)

Travel grants

Who may apply: Architects, cross-disciplinary groups and other professionals with a relation to the Danish architecture scene may apply.

Purpose of the program: The purpose of the program is to provide possibilities for groups and individuals that wish to conduct research on relevant issues within the field of architecture, by seeking out new knowledge, inspiration and partnerships abroad or in Denmark. We encourage applicants to travel environmentally responsible.

Deadline: two annual deadlines (February and September).

Events, festivals and fairs

Name of event: Biennale di Venezia – Architettura

Short description: Across 63 national pavilions and a curated main exhibition program the Venice Biennale for architecture presents a vast amount new architectural projects and exhibitions. The Danish Arts Foundation's Committee for Architecture supports the Danish pavilion at the Venice Biennale.

Takes place in May 2022

Crafts and design

The Danish Arts Foundation works to support Danish craft and design internationally by funding designers, craftsmen and projects that promote Danish craft and design.

Funding

Name of program: **Craft and design projects in Denmark and abroad**

Who may apply: Museums and other exhibition spaces, private galleries, craft and design organizations and international curators etc. who wish to:

- (a) exhibit or showcase Danish contemporary craft and design
- (b) arrange seminars, talk, workshops etc. in connection with an exhibition of Danish contemporary craft and design
- (c) publish catalogues or other information material (printed or digital) about Danish contemporary craft and design in connection with an exhibition

Please note:

Danish craftsmen and designers whose work will be exhibited abroad can themselves apply for grants for production of the works for exhibitions abroad.

Purpose of the program: The Danish Arts Foundation's Committee for Crafts and Design Project Funding wishes to promote the visibility of Danish contemporary crafts and design on the international scene by supporting:

- (a) Travel and accommodation - Support for Danish contemporary crafts people and designers' travel, accommodation and honorarium in connection with a residency or an exhibition or a show of their works and related events outside Denmark
- (b) Transport and insurance of works - Support for transport and insurance of the exhibited works
- (c) Creating exhibition, show or fair - Support for building up the exhibition/show, curator/participant honorarium, the price of an exhibition stand etc.
- (d) Catalogues and other information material - Support for publications and other information material (digital and printed) produced in connection with an exhibition/a

show of Danish contemporary craft and design aiming to increase the visibility of Danish contemporary crafts and design on the international scene

Deadline: Two annual deadlines

Events, Festivals and Fairs

Name of event: 3daysofdesign

Short description: 3daysofdesign is an annual design event that draws journalists, buyers and design enthusiasts from around the world to Copenhagen, to experience Danish design in a unique collaboration between top design companies and designers. www.3daysofdesign.dk

Name of event: The Biennale for Craft and Design

Short description: The Biennale is an exhibition and a competition taking stock of Danish crafts and design today. <https://www.biennalen.dk/en/>

Literature

The Danish Arts Foundation's Committee for Literary Project Funding works to promote Danish literature at home and abroad and helps facilitate literary exchange projects between Denmark and other countries. We work to support, promote and raise the profile of Danish literature internationally by coordinating the Danish presence at international literary and cultural events and projects abroad.

We organise the Danish Arts Foundation's stands at the most important international book fairs, visiting and research programmes for international translators, publishers, journalists and promoters.

Funding

Name of program: **Fund for Danish Literature Abroad and Foreign Literature in Denmark**

Who may apply: You may apply for subsidies from this fund for translations to and from Danish, sample translations, mentor support for translators, events for authors and network support for translators, travel grants for translators and research travel for publishers, etc.

Deadlines: Two annual deadlines

Name of program: **Fund for Danish and Foreign Literature for Children and Young Adults**

Who may apply: You may apply for subsidies from this fund for production of Danish books for children and young adults, for translations to and from Danish, literary events, literary festivals, support for development of digital stories for children and young adults, for translations, travel and research, and other literary projects for children and young adults.

Deadlines: Two annual deadlines

Name of program: **Nordic Translation Fund – Inter-Nordic Translations**

Who may apply: The fund is open to Nordic publishers wishing to publish a work translated from Danish to a Nordic language. Support for translations into Danish must be sought from within the

country in which the respective work was originally published. The funds for Nordic translations are distributed on behalf of Nordic Culture Point's Culture and Art Programme under the Nordic Council of Ministers.

Deadlines: Two annual deadlines

Purpose of the programs:

(a) Translations and sample translations:

Support is provided to foreign publishing houses and theatres that publish works translated from Danish. Support is provided for translation costs of fiction and non-fiction works of general cultural interest translated by professionals. It is also possible for foreign translators, theatres and publishers to apply for support to finance sample translations of Danish literature.

(b) Production:

Publishers may apply for production support for especially expensive works and illustrated works.

(c) Events:

Subsidies for literary events and promotion of Danish literature abroad. Applications for subsidies are accepted from foreign publishers, diplomatic representations abroad, cultural institutions and others who wish to promote and increase knowledge about Danish literature outside Denmark. Support may also be provided to defray costs in connection with Danish authors' participation in literary festivals, readings and publication events abroad. Support may be provided to foreign authors travelling to Denmark on the same basis.

(d) Network:

Network support is provided to activities in local networks of translators from Danish. The networks must strengthen translators' access to knowledge about Danish language and literature, and at the same time ensure that there are frameworks for new, promising translators.

(e) Research:

Support may be provided to foreign publishers, heads of festivals and the like who wish to acquire an insight into contemporary Danish literature and visit Danish publishers, festivals etc., to strengthen networks and dialogue between the Danish and international literary partners. In addition travel grants can also be awarded translators of Danish literature for research purposes (meetings, residencies etc.).

(f) Development of digital stories (only in the fund for children and young adults)

Support for development of digital stories for children and young adults.

Music

We work to support, promote and raise the profile of Danish music internationally by coordinating the Danish presence at international music projects and cultural events abroad. We arrange visiting and research programmes in Denmark. The administration of state grants for international musical exchange within the genres of contemporary music, rock, jazz, folk, and world music has been decentralised. The genre

organisations for rock, jazz, folk, and world music are each responsible for awarding grants for international exchange projects within their own genres.

Funding

Name of program: **International Visiting Program and networking activities**

Who may apply: Danish musicians and composers for visits, travel grants, and residencies abroad.

Musicians, composers, festival directors, concert organizers, music directors, music producers, agents and music journalists outside Denmark for visits to Denmark with a Danish host.

The application must be submitted by a Danish partner.

Purpose of the program: The program has the overall purpose of promoting and developing Danish music through dialogue with the international music and arts scene. This may occur through:

- (a) Activities abroad that help to develop the individual musician or composer professionally and to promote the construction of personal networks and international familiarity with Danish music.
- (b) Activities in Denmark in which Danish professionals, institutions, organizations etc. act as hosts for foreign musicians, composers, journalists, music professionals whose visit will help develop the Danish music scene.

Deadlines: Two annual deadlines, March and October. Application forms can be found online at www.kunst.dk

Name of program: **Commissioned Works**

Who may apply: Orchestras, ensembles, musicians or institutions wishing to perform or stage a performance of a new commissioned work by a Danish composer. The commissioner/applicant must have concluded an agreement with the artist/composer, who must have accepted the task and the commission. Foreign commissioners of works can also apply.

Purpose of the program: The aim of this scheme is to provide grants to cover composer fees for commissioned works.

Deadlines: 4 annual deadlines. Application forms can be found online at www.kunst.dk

Name of program: **Composers-in-Residency**

Who may apply: There is no fixed framework for future residencies, but interested orchestras, ensembles and host organizations are welcome to contact the committee with proposals for new residencies.

Purpose of the program: To stimulate collaborations between composers and orchestras, ensembles, festivals etc. through residencies. Residencies are expected to last at least 2 years.

Deadlines: Continuous. Application forms can be found online at www.kunst.dk

Name of the program: **Career Program for Young Talented Artists**

Who may apply: Young artists working within the art forms architecture, visual arts, film, crafts and design, literature, music and performing arts. Applicants must have a high artistic level and international potential.

Purpose of the program: To provide support and artistic development to the most talented young artists with international potential over a period of two years. The artists will develop a career strategy in collaboration with a professional consultant. The support from the arts foundation can be spent on for example master classes, competitions, coaching, mentors, consultants, travel expenses, PR and marketing.

Deadline: One annual deadline in September.

All genre organizations are funded by the Danish Arts Foundation.

MXD, Music Export Denmark: Works with funding and projects and cooperates on a Nordic level in NOMEX.

MXD organizes Danish participation in: Reeperbahn Festival Hamburg, SPOT On Denmark projects in Germany, Holland, Belgium, Switzerland and France, NOMEX – JaJaJa London, Berlin and Tokyo

Events, festivals and fairs

Roskilde Festival (Pop/Rock)

The largest international music festival in Northern Europe is Roskilde Festival with an audience of 70.000. The festival has existed since 1971 and presents an up to date and progressive music program plus an extensive program of events, art and activities.

Spot Festival (Up-Coming)

Three-day festival in Aarhus presenting up-coming Danish bands and guest bands from the Nordic countries, including concerts with pop/rock, jazz, world and contemporary music organized since 1995 by ROSA – The Danish Rock Council. An important meeting place for talent spotters, festival organizers, etc. from all over Europe.

NorthSide Aarhus (Pop/Rock)

Rock and pop music festival held in June at Ådalen in Aarhus, held since 2010, growing from a one-day event to a three-day festival. The festival is organized in cooperation with the German concert company FKP Scorpio.

Tinderbox Odense (Pop/Rock)

Rock and pop music festival held for the first time 2015 in June in Tusindårsskoven, Odense. The festival is organized in cooperation with the German concert company FKP Scorpio.

Smukfest (Pop/Rock)

One of the oldest and largest Danish festivals, presenting Danish and international rock and pop since 1980 in the woods of Skanderborg in Jutland.

STRØM (Electronica)

An annually recurrent and growing electronic event and playground in August, one of the most important electronic music events in Northern Europe

Stella Polaris (Electronica)

A nation-wide festival tour in August, bringing electronic music in a one-day festival to Sønderborg, Kolding, Aarhus and Copenhagen / Frederiksberg.

Copenhagen Distortion (Electronica)

www.cphdistortion.dk

Has been held in May-June since 1998 and is a tribute to the Copenhagen club scene. DJs are presented from the entire Copenhagen scene. The festival takes place over five days at the start of June at various Copenhagen locations.

Copenhagen Jazz Festival (Jazz)

Founded in 1979 the festival comprises nearly 700 concerts and events in 10 days each year. The festival takes place all over central Copenhagen, indoor and outdoor, in the beginning of July.

Aarhus Jazz Festival (Jazz)

International celebrities and local stars are presented in the festival organized in Aarhus since 1989 by Musikhuset Aarhus and other local venues. The whole city is backing the eight days of jazz, more and more venues are added each year.

Tønder Festival (Folk)

The major folk music festival in Denmark taking place in Tønder each year in the last week of August. The festival site has a capacity of nearly 4000 in two large tents. Programs are presented also at several other venues in the town.

Copenhagen World Music Festival (World Music)

An annual world music-festival in Copenhagen in September presenting world music from Denmark and abroad. Venues and organizations cooperate in a common festival platform to present the many world music genres.

Copenhagen Opera Festival (Opera)

An annual opera festival in July creating new space for opera in the streets, canals, churches, halls and homes of Copenhagen, with new initiatives from international talent as well as from established local institutions.

Tivoli Festival (Classical)

Scandinavia's largest classical music festival running from May until September, presenting more than 50 concerts each summer with internationally renowned conductors, singers and instrumentalists in the old amusement park Tivoli-Gardens in central Copenhagen.

SPOR Festival (Contemporary Classical)

A festival in Aarhus for new sound art and art music. The festival takes place each year in the beginning of May. The program is compiled every year by a curator.

KLANG Copenhagen Avantgarde Festival (Contemporary Classical)

A contemporary music festival in May presenting concerts that mix music with theatre, dance and visual art. Founded as Athelas New Music Festival in 2011. In the recent edition of the festival, more than 40 concerts and events were presented throughout eleven days with more than 30 orchestras, ensembles and soloists.

G((o))NG TOMORROW (Contemporary Classical)

An annual festival in Copenhagen for new experimental music and sound art – sound without boundaries. Founded under the name Wundergrund in 2006 the festival features contemporary classical, experimental popular music and electronica, often in cooperation with other art forms such as dance, architecture, video and design.

Aarhus Festival – Aarhus Festuge (City festival of Arts and Culture)

An annual festival in Aarhus for arts and culture, which is one of the largest and oldest festivals of culture in the Northern countries. Founded in 1965, the festival consists of concerts, performances, art installations, theatre, street food and family activities. Most activities are free of charge. The city organizes the large festival (10 days) with more than a thousand events and 500.000 participants.

Den Unge Kunstneriske Elite – Career Program for Young Talented Artists

Name of the program: **Career Program for Young Talented Artists**

Who may apply: Young artists working within the art forms architecture, visual arts, film, crafts and design, literature, music and performing arts. Applicants must have a high artistic level and international potential.

Purpose of the program: To provide support and artistic development to the most talented young artists with international potential over a period of two years. The artists will develop a career strategy in collaboration with a professional consultant. The support from the arts foundation can be spent on for example master classes, competitions, coaching, mentors, consultants, travel expenses, PR and marketing.

Deadline: One annual deadline in September.

Performing Arts

We work to support, promote and raise the profile of Danish performing arts internationally by coordinating the Danish presence at international performing arts and cultural events and projects abroad.

We organise the Danish booths at international conferences, festivals and showcases.

We arrange residencies in Denmark and abroad as well as visiting and research programmes for international festivals, stage directors, theatre companies and other exponents of the performing arts in order to increase awareness of Danish performing arts.

Funding

Name of program: **PERFORMING ARTS: INTERNATIONAL ACTIVITIES**

Who may apply: Professionals from Denmark and from abroad organising or working with performing arts activities.

Purpose of the program:

The purpose of the program is to promote performing arts of high artistic quality in Denmark and Danish performing arts abroad. The Committee for Performing Arts Project Funding has two annual deadlines for grants for international activities of up to DKK 75.000.

The Danish Arts Foundation's Committee for Performing Arts Project Funding seeks to develop and promote Danish performing arts through interaction with the international performing arts scene.

We achieve this by supporting:

- International guest performances and touring
- Networking and research aimed at international collaborations and co-productions, including participation in workshops abroad as a speaker and the invitation of guests for performances in Denmark
- International residencies

Name of program: **Performing Arts for Children, Young People, and Adults**

Who may apply: Professionals from Denmark and from abroad organising or working with performing arts activities.

Purpose of the program:

The purpose of the program is to promote performing arts of a high artistic quality in Denmark and Danish performing arts abroad. This includes:

- promoting the development of new forms of performing arts and other experimental activities within the performing arts, including:
 - performing arts activities and projects targeted at children, young people, and adults
 - reproductions where an agreement with a venue can be documented
 - cross-disciplinary projects
- ensuring geographical diversification
- facilitating the encounter between Danish performing arts and the international performing arts scene through international activities, including co-productions, international guest performances and tours, and residencies

Name of program: **Nordic Translation Fund – Inter-Nordic Translations**

Who may apply: The fund is open to Nordic publishers wishing to publish a work translated from Danish to a Nordic language. Support for translations into Danish must be sought from within the country in which the respective work was originally published. The funds for Nordic translations are distributed on behalf of Nordic Culture Point's Culture and Art Programme under the Nordic Council of Ministers.

Festivals

CPH Stage

Copenhagen based theatre Festival that presents performances from theatres from all of Denmark as well as a smaller number of international performances in June every year. Organized by a central secretariat and curated by the venues of Copenhagen that host the performances (fringe). The festival also caters to an international audience (buyers and presenters) with an international track (2-4 days) planned specifically for this group and with performances in English or with sub/surtitles.

Every second year in the city of Vordingborg. Presents mostly large scale work in public spaces from Denmark and abroad as well as from Cantabile 2, the regional theatre that has initiated the festival.

ILT Festival (International Living Theatre)

Danish and international performances. Every second year in Aarhus. Next festival is in June 2023.

Det Frie Felts Festival/ Selected

A biennial festival presenting the independent performing arts community in Denmark (mostly dance and performance). Next festival will be in 2023.

Metropolis, Copenhagen International Theatre (KIT)

Takes place annually all over Denmark with a focus on Copenhagen. Mostly presents outdoor work, interacting with public space and people's everyday life. Organised by Copenhagen International Theatre.

Nordic showcase of contemporary dance and performance from the Nordic countries. Next edition will be held in Helsinki in June 2022.

Horsens Children's Theatre Festival

A curated festival displaying a large number of the Danish children's theatre companies. Annually 4 days in September in the city of Horsens, Jutland.

The April Festival

The largest children's theatre festival in Denmark. Takes place annually in April in a different city. In 2022 it will be held in ESBJERG from March 27 to April 3. The festival offers a display of close to 500 shows and the festival is frequented by international guests, presenters and buyers.

Danish Plus Festival

A biennial three day curated showcase of dance, theatre and performance for children and youth held in Aarhus. Aimed at a professional international buying and presenting audience. All performances are non-verbal or performed in English. Next edition is May 9-11 2022.

International Activities and Projects

The Danish Arts Foundation and The Agency for Culture and Palaces promote Danish performing arts abroad by organizing:

- Promotion of Danish contemporary dance, choreography and performance at Tanzmesse , Düsseldorf, Germany every second year in August (next time 2022)
- Promotion of Danish companies at CINARS, Montreal, Canada, every second year in November (next time 2022)
- Promotion of Danish companies and performances at Edinburgh Festival Fringe, Scotland, annually in august (next time in 2022)
- Danish companies at Performing Arts Market Seoul, Korea, annually (next time in 2022)
- International Visiting Programmes
- Residencies in Denmark
- Residencies and fellowships abroad
- Danish participation in special upcoming projects, such as Nordic Bridges in Canada (2022), Foreign Ministry related strategic projects etc.

The Agency for Culture and Palaces participates in a number of networks, international meetings and conferences, including ISPA (International Society for the Performing Arts), IETM (International network for contemporary performing arts), Nordics Combined (Nordic collaboration) and others.

Visual Arts

We work to support, promote and develop the profile of Danish Visual Arts internationally by supporting the presence and involvement of Danish art at international visual art events and projects.

We fund artists, museums, galleries, exhibition spaces and art professionals who promote Danish and international art in Denmark and Danish art internationally.

We organise research and visiting programmes for artists and art professionals in Denmark and abroad. We also commission the Danish Pavilion at the Venice Biennale.

Funding

Guidelines for applying and criteria for funding are described in detail online.

Name of program: **Danish Art Abroad**

Who may apply: Danish artists invited to exhibit abroad

Purpose of the program: Danish artists invited to exhibit abroad can personally apply for production costs related to new works, exhibition costs, and artist fee. Additionally either the foreign exhibition venue or the Danish artist/s can apply for transport of works and artists' travel and accommodation connected to the installation and opening.

Deadline: 4 annual deadlines

Name of program / Who may apply: Foreign artists invited to exhibit in Denmark

Purpose of the program: Foreign artists, who are invited to exhibit in Denmark, may receive funding; not for work production, but for i.e. travel and accommodation related to installation and exhibition opening. In these cases the Danish exhibition venue must apply for funding on behalf of the foreign artist.

Additionally: If the foreign artist is to produce a site specific work at the Danish exhibition venue, the venue may apply for a production fee to the foreign artist, and also for the foreign artists' accommodation in Denmark during production of the site-specific work.

Deadline: 4 annual deadlines

Name of program: **Exhibition of Danish Art Abroad**

Who may apply: Foreign exhibition venues exhibiting Danish artists

Purpose of the program: Foreign exhibition venues can apply for transport of art works and Danish artists' travel and accommodation connected to the installation and opening.

Deadline: 4 annual deadlines

Name of program: **International Research Program**

Who may apply: Foreign curators, who wish to meet Danish artists in research for future exhibitions

Purpose of the program: The programme's aim is to provide curators from abroad insight into contemporary Danish art and the Danish art scene, and to strengthen networking and dialogue between the Danish and international art scene. Curators can apply for funding for travel and accommodation.

Deadline: Continuous, answer after 2 weeks

Name of program / Who may apply: Danish artists invited to artists' residencies abroad

Purpose of the program: Danish artists can apply for residency programme expenses, stipend, travel expenses, and housing expenses.

Deadline: Continuous, answer after 5 weeks

Residency programs

Collaborative agreement between Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Ministry for Culture

The Danish Ministry of Culture and the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs support international cultural collaboration through a project and development funding scheme. The purpose of the funding scheme is to support specific cultural activities abroad between Danish and foreign actors. The funding scheme for 2022 will close on December 31st 2022 at the latest, or when the funding is exhausted.

Funding

Name of program: **Project and development funding for international cultural collaboration**

Who may apply: The funding scheme is aimed at a broad range of actors who wish to engage in international cultural collaboration within the purview of the Danish Ministry of Culture. Danish participants can apply in collaboration with local Danish missions and/or a local division of the Danish Cultural Institute. Applications are to be submitted by the Danish missions and/or local divisions of cultural institutes. *Purpose of the program:* The purpose of the funding scheme is to support collaboration projects for Danish art and culture abroad.

The funding scheme is anchored in the Collaboration Agreement between the Danish Ministry of Culture and the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs on Denmark's international cultural collaboration, which has the following purposes:

- To promote Denmark's cultural exports abroad
- To promote intercultural dialogue between Danish and foreign actors
- To promote the marketing of Denmark as a country
- To promote innovation in Danish art and culture through international collaboration

Name of program: **Embassy Film Package**

Who may apply: Danish Foreign Missions.

The Embassy film package is made in agreement with the producers and in accordance with international festival rights, and is readily available to be screened in Blu-Ray format and as an online streaming option at local festivals, where the representative is involved.
